

The **Trash Amendment Action Plan** engages residents in six structured activities to eliminate trash and litter in their neighborhood, helping cities meet the requirements of the Statewide Water Quality Control Plans for Trash.

## Program Design

In this self-directed program, residents learn about the civic framework of the Trash Amendments and the environmental impact of trash in our waterways. Then, they are directed to follow the structured activities to complete meaningful actions in their immediate neighborhood.

## Structured Activities

Residents begin by conducting an assessment of litter and trash in their neighborhood using the trash assessment form. Based on the data collected, they design strategies to reduce litter and change behaviors. Residents then take action to eliminate trash, and begin the process of changing behaviors that lead to litter. After the plans and actions have been implemented, residents conduct a final assessment and send results sent to the city.



## Outcomes

- Identification of neighborhood litter Hot Spots.
- Customized solutions for each neighborhood
- Community engagement in eliminating trash and litter in local waterways
- Report of structural and behavioral modifications
- A documented trash-free zone
